Dear Deputy Director Martinez,

In the weeks since President Trump was elected, the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau (CFPB) has continued to act of its own accord, regardless of direction of the new administration. Given the shift in policy direction, it is essential to ensure that enforcement actions align with new leadership priorities and directives.

I hereby request that you suspend any enforcement actions pending as of or commenced after November 5, 2024 until a new Director is confirmed by the United States Senate.

This request includes any enforcement action that is public or nonpublic. Any un-served and/or pending civil investigative demands (CIDs) should be rescinded/revoked immediately, with prompt notice given to the relevant CID recipients. (This request excludes ongoing litigation subject to statutory or judicial deadlines that require prompt action.)

This transition period presents an opportunity to reassess ongoing and planned enforcement actions to ensure they are consistent with the new administration's objectives and policy approach. Continuing enforcement without such review will lead to unnecessary uncertainty, legal challenges, and inefficiencies that could be avoided by temporarily suspending non-essential actions.

I anticipate further communication on this subject from Congress to President Trump and I am hopeful President Trump will resolve this matter if you are unwilling to do so.
